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Over the years we've prayed for and encouraged prayer for schools and colleges around Colchester through termly prayer gatherings, a week of online resources to get people praying for schools and this year, prayer meetings via Zoom.

From time to time we have also prayer walked. God doesn't necessarily hear our prayers more clearly when we prayer walk, but I do believe that we can hear God's heart more clearly. There's something powerful about recognising how He is already at work in the place where we're praying and inviting us to be part of His mission among those people.

On one occasion we had approached a school about starting chaplaincy. We had worked with them for many years, and had the right person lined up for the role. But to move from being visitors to having someone who was clearly identified as chaplain working in the school each week was a big step up and had to be approved by the governors. We asked a few people to pray and for a few weeks prior to the decision I decided to prayer walk around the school, asking God to open the door wider. I was delighted when the Governors approved the idea and a year later one of the deputy heads declared himself to have moved from being a sceptic to being a convert about having a chaplain in the school.

Several years ago Christian Youth Outreach (CYO) undertook a sponsored walk around all ten of the secondary schools and the two FE colleges of our town. We invited people from local churches to join us along the route to pray with us for a specific school. There was patchy take up but where people did turn out to pray or walk with us it was fun, affirming and inspiring.

We had hoped to repeat the idea as a prayer walk last year but realised that not many people feel able to walk 19 miles in a day, no matter how prayerful they are. It also felt as though the scale of the activity, all the secondary schools and colleges in a day, seriously overwhelmed the purpose - to encourage people to pray for their local schools. So the idea was re-invented as a series of shorter, slower walks in different parts of the town that could take in more schools including local primaries. This made it more achievable for more people, and the smaller area covered each time had the potential to engage local Christians more meaningfully.

We did this during May, joining with thousands of others around the country who were praying for schools at about the same time. It was exciting to get out to walk with others and to pray for our schools. And I'm excited to hear and see what God might go on to do in revealing his blessing, grace and peace among these communities, their staff and children.

CYO Colchester is a community of people, both staff and volunteers, working in Colchester schools and FE colleges. Our work encompasses chaplaincy, mentoring and a wide range of projects that support the pastoral, spiritual and faith development of children and young people.

We've been helping young people to explore prayer through our prayer spaces in schools since 2008 and regularly encourage local Christians to pray for schools in lots of different ways.

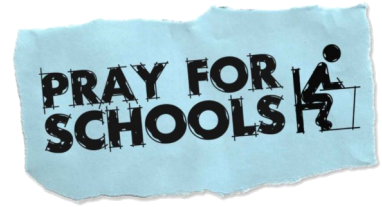

## Prayer Walk 21 and OIKOS

What are you planning to do this summer? There are lots of things we can't be certain of. Where can we travel? What will the weather will be like? When can we sing again in church?

Hope for Every Home has an idea that we can certainly all take part in – on our daily walk or on a virtual walk from our own home, or just while we are out and about this summer. "Any walk, real or virtual can become a prayer walk," says Sammy Jordan, project leader for Hope for Every Home.

Hope for Every Home, part of HOPE Together, has recently launched OIKOS, a new prayer walking app, as part of Prayer Walk 21. You can find the app free in your app store under OIKOS Outreach or on the Hope for Every Home website [Hope for Every Home : The Prayer App](#)

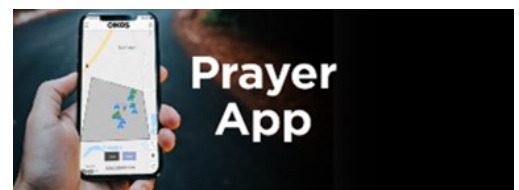
During Covid and lockdown, God has taken his church out of the building, reconnected people with their local communities and mobilised us through our daily walk. Now the invitation is to turn the daily walk into a prayer walk. Over the next year the Prayer Walk 21 challenge is to pray for the people in every street, every road, and every lane in the UK.

Sammy says, 'We don't want this to be an extra thing for people to do, but part of our every day; as we go to the shops, to school, to work, on a walk, to the park, to see a friend...and even on holiday! As you pray for your local school could you also pray for the street it's on and pin a prayer on the OIKOS app?'

The OIKOS app is simple to use. To pin a prayer, use your finger to move the map to where you want to pray and tap the screen. You can also pin a 'share' when you have shared faith through a caring action, an invitation, or a conversation for example.

Praying for every street, every road, every lane in the UK is huge but it starts with each of us stepping outside our front doors and praying as part of our day to day. There are resources available on the Hope for Every Home website to support you, including a great one from Pray for Schools, and some designed to help families prayer walk together this summer. So, as part of Prayer Walk 21, download the OIKOS app. Pray as you walk your local streets praying for schools, and get your friends involved too!







## Revealing Jesus to children and young people

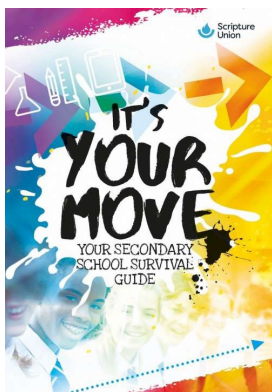
Have you heard about the new Revealing Jesus Mission strategy from Scripture Union to reach the 95% not in contact with church.? As I hope you will know, in recent years SU have been focussing their energies on the 95% of children and young people who don't regularly attend a church. On the back of this, they have recently launched their Revealing Jesus strategy which looks at how churches might reach out to these children and young people through a four-fold approach of **Connect, Explore, Respond and Grow**.

The idea is that churches would appoint (volunteer) **FaithGuides** who, with Scripture Union's support and resources, would be a catalyst for mission in their communities and help the children on their spiritual path to a place where they can grow and be nurtured. The good news is that this scheme is free (though SU is always willing to receive any donations to its ministry!) and will provide a place where these Faith Guides can share and grow together which will be to their benefit and to the church.

Faith Guides will commit to be there for the long run, helping children and young people find and grow in their faith. And through the development of Grow Communities, they'll provide relevant and meaningful opportunities for those they've been journeying with to meet regularly with their peers, to worship and grow together.

## Time to move.

It's time for us to move the 1740 "It's Your Move" books out of our Administrator's garage!

We are coming to the end of this academic year, and what a crazy one it has been! So, the season for finishing off and preparing for something new begins. As Christian Schools' Workers it is such a privilege to head into primary schools across York and support Year 6 students as they prepare to move to secondary school. We hear about their excitements and their fears, and can share our belief that God loves them and is with them in this move, and in every move.

We have many highlights in these lessons. One of them is partnering with Year 7 students to put together a video of interviews about their experiences to use in our lessons. Another is that we are always keen to partner with local churches as we work with schools, and many local churches around York gift the wonderful Scripture Union books to the Year 6's in partnership with YoYo's "It's Your Move" lessons.

Alongside this local church partnership, our various rhythms of prayer as an organisation support and inspire our work with students and schools in this transition time, from our own personal prayer life, weekly Zoom prayer meetings attended by YoYo supporters, monthly prayer letters, a monthly teacher's prayer space, and a week of prayer for YoYo in May.

Throughout this year YoYo has experienced God inspiring and lifting us through prayer and partnership with amazing supporters as we have found ways to bring our Christian Faith alive in schools in and out of lockdowns. So, this year we pray in faith that God guides the logistics of distributing these wonderful Scripture Union books into the hands of 1740 Year 6 children across York before their move to secondary school, and pray that they will experience God's blessings and provision during this time of moving on.
