

**3.9 million** children in the UK are living in poverty

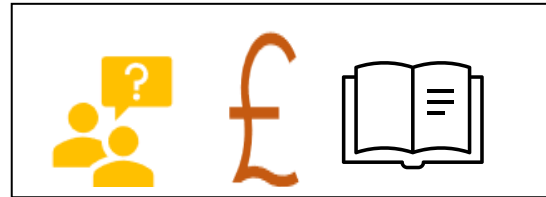
That's **3 in 10 children**

Children are in poverty if they grow up in families with incomes below **60%** of the average



**NASUWT survey 6,500 teachers**

- 60% said pupils arrive hungry
- 70% said more lack energy
- 58% gave pupils food or clothing
- 15% lent or gave money
