Shine in Schools is all about two things:

EQUIPPING Christian young people to live for God at school and providing opportunities to **EXPLORE** the Christian faith at school.

SHINE is a 3-week video resource designed to do help do this. This year's theme is KNOWN. There are additional new videos in their Equip Series on How and Why to share your faith. (See the <u>website</u> or information on page 3)

SHINE is a partnership between Crown Jesus Ministries, Scripture Union NI, Logos Ministries International, Scripture Union England and Wales, Scripture Union Ireland and Scripture Union Scotland.

Having been inspired myself by this year's videos I asked Geoff Brown (SU) what his prayer requests for this year's Shine in Schools were.

- Let's pray that more people right across England and Wales get to hear about Shine and consider how they could use it either in a church youth group or as an opportunity to explore faith in a school group.
- We pray that Christian young people would be challenged and inspired by the 2 new Equip Series videos ('Why?' share your faith and 'How?' to share your faith).
- We lift up all the schools using Shine this year and pray that young people who are not yet Christians would be interested to know more about the God who knows them and who they can know.
- We also ask God for wisdom for the Shine partners as they make plans for next year's theme, write scripts and record videos in the Spring.

What is SHINE IN SCHOOLS?

It's all about two things:

These videos are designed to help inspire young people who will be using **SHINE** to share their faith with their friends.

Let's pray together Issue: Anti-bullying



'The Lord is a shelter for the oppressed, a refuge in times of trouble. Those who know your name trust in you, for you, O Lord, do not abandon those who search for you.' PSALM 9:9,10 (NLT)

This year's Anti-Bullying Week is Monday 13th to Friday 17th November. It would be good to pray about this disturbing issue which is possibly happening in our own local schools.

https://anti-bullyingalliance.org.uk defines bullying like this:

'The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power.'

It can be physical, verbal and psychological and can happen face-to-face or online.

Impacts of bullying on children include:

Facing barriers to learning Missing school Being excluded Strain on families/carers Self-harm and depression

Department of Education research looking at pupils in Year 10 found that:-

40% of young people were bullied in the last 12 months

6% had experienced bullying daily.

Most common form of bullying was name calling (including via text and email) at 26%, followed by exclusion from social groups at 18%

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21% who had experienced bullying daily had truanted in the last 12 months

1 in 4 with SEN (special educational needs) experienced violence (actual or threatened)

Merciful Father, we know You care for everyone who is bullied. Please draw close to victims and perpetrators and help them to put their trust in You to see change, freedom and peace. In Jesus' name. Amen.

KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE ONLINE

We asked Rev Celia Bowring, Chair of Pray for Schools and CARE Prayer Champion to update us:

It seems pretty obvious that we must do everything possible to protect our children. In recent years schools and other institutions have been required to create safeguarding policies and make sure they're followed. Risk assessments surround every activity. We are all more vigilant than ever before – and yet children's online lives remain open to danger. Even though the 2017 Digital Economy Act required much tighter security to prevent young people from accessing 'adult material' on the internet through age verification checks this never happened. In October 2019 the government ditched their commitment to the scheme and as a result children are being increasingly exposed to pornography on the devices they use.

CARE has always been committed to protecting the innocence of childhood and campaigning for young people are as well protected online as they are offline. In 2020, the British Board of Film Classification's 2020 survey revealed that more than half of children had encountered pornography by 11-13 years old, rising to 79% by age 17 and although this often happens unintentionally it is becoming normalised amongst young people. The report found that many children had stumbled across upsetting or disturbing 'aggressive' or 'violent' pornography, including content they felt normalised rape. Through videos appearing on home pages of pornography sites some reported getting lost in 'rabbit holes' leading them to increasingly graphic content.

Thank God that at the end of October the government's Online Safety Act received Royal Assent and has now become law because it does place a new duty of care on tech companies to take more responsibility for the content shown on their platforms. They will need to prove they are taking steps to remove illegal content, including:

- child sexual abuse
- controlling or coercive behaviour
- extreme sexual violence
- promoting self-harm

They must protect children from harmful material (even if it is legal) and Ofcom has been given powers to make sure this is enforced. For more than seven years we've been asking for age verification on commercial porn sites like Porn Hub and also social media platforms where adult material is accessed. Breaking the rules could result in massive fines and bosses could face prison!

For more than seven years, CARE's been campaigning for this with a range of politicians and although age -verification will by no means cure the problem it sends a huge message.

Let's pray that this will mark a radical change of attitude in society towards pornography, taking seriously the immense harm it can do to children. And please remember teachers and other pastoral staff as they encounter young people who are struggling with this issue.

Gemma from Youthscape said "although we pray together as a team for the schools work we do and the schools we work in already, it was **really powerful** to gather with other Christians from across the country to do this via Zoom and it reminded us afresh that we're part of a bigger mission"

Lisa from Scripture Union comments " it was a really **significant day of prayer for schools** across England and Wales. It is an initiative that will grow each year and hopefully lead to more prayer for schools throughout the year too.

Sammy Jordan from Hope for every Home writes:

"At Hope For Every Home we want to pray for every street, road and lane in the country. Not as a tick box, transactional exercise but because we believe prayer changes things, breaking up the ground as we partner with God to see his kingdom, 'on earth as it is in heaven.' Praying for schools is a massive part of this because if we pray for every street we will pray for every school. So it's always a privilege to be part of the National Day of Prayer for Schools and **intentionally set time aside to pray**. When I do, I'm always reminded of the reach of schools as we pray for students, teachers, other staff and families. The ground being broken up as we pray for schools reaches far and wide into communities. A few years ago I did a 'back of the envelope' estimate of how many households might be connected to a school through work/ volunteer roles and relationships as family, friends and neighbours. I estimated 75%...wow! That's why, for me, praying for schools is one of the most strategic and spiritually impactful things I think I can do as I break up ground through prayer seeking to join in with what God is doing to see his 'kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven'."
